


## Roller Derby, Defined





Invented by Leo Seltzer, roller derby originally paired co-ed couples in a marathon roller skating race with participants furiously circling a track approximating the distance between New York and LA. The first Trans Continental Roller Derby took over a month to complete and only 9 of the original 25 pairs actually finished the grueling ordeal.

Like any great promoter, Seltzer soon realized these collisions were the most thrilling part of the game, which he tweaked to maximize the carnage. Two teams of five skaters now circled the pack, with each team sending out a "Jammer" to skate around and lap members of the opposing team for points. Derby became a full-contact physical sport, with elbows, body-checks and fights galore, and the fans loved it.



By the early '50s, roller derby reached its peak, with games regularly drawing 30-40,000 fans and skaters gracing the covers of national magazines. The sport sustained its popularity through the '70s, but then due to high travel costs during the gas crisis in the 1970s and over-sensationalized antics, it slipped into pop culture oblivion - until now.

Today, in post-millennium America, "everything old is new again" – including the roller derby. A neo-derby renaissance is fully at hand, with aggressive all-girl skaters jamming the pack to restore the sport to its hard-hitting former glory.

In locations as diverse as New York, Los Angeles, Phoenix, Tucson, Raleigh, Austin, Las Vegas and Milwaukee, a new generation of fierce female athletes is paying homage to the energetic, explosive traditions of derby past, while updating them slightly for a more sophisticated, modern audience.

## Roller Derby, Refined

Since the Austin, Texas-based Bad Girl/Good Woman Productions (AKA)
Lonestar Rollergirls first hit the rink in 2001, the all-girl roller derby revival
has been gathering speed at an increasingly frenzied pace. This new incarnation is a sport with
real rules, real penalties, real injuries and real champions. The addition of a few modern touches
– like tattoos and torn fishnets, live local bands at halftime, and enough bad-girl attitude to fuel
countless cat-fights – has resurrected mainstream interest in this long-dormant sport.

Founded in 2003, GGRD, LLC has helped lead the charge to bring the American-born sport of Roller Derby back to the limelight. Gotham started out as 10 girls inspired by the Austin girls



practicing everywhere they could lay down their wheels. Since then, GGRD has grown to a fleet of 64 skaters on 4 teams with 9 referees, 4 mascots and countless support staff. By the end of 2005 – GGRD's inaugural season - the monthly games were drawing 1500+ fans to a rundown disco skating rink in the South Bronx without a bar or liquor license – and fans couldn't get enough.

Lines out the door and down the block characterized the 2005 season game nights.

Many fans lined up early to get a seat on the floor around a curve in track (later christened the "Corner of Death") in hopes that they'd be lucky enough to get a skater flying off the track into their lap — and usually were not disappointed. Older men and women who loved old-school derby came dripping in body paint cheering on their favorite skaters. Williamsburg hipsters were clumped next to gobs of 10-year-old girls who were attending their friend's birthday party at the GGRD Championship game. All left the rink asking when the next game would be and what colors they should wear to support their favorite teams and skaters.

All-Girl derby fever has spread like wildfire. GGRD is a proud member of the Women's Flat Track Derby Association (WFTDA) along with 30 other active, skater owned and operated leagues

around the country, and celebrates the 80+ leagues currently in various stages of formation. Individual established leagues in Minnesota and Washington are drawing crowds of 3-5000 people, and interleague games are drawing enormous crowds.

In February 2005, GGRD participated in the first all-girl national roller derby tournament in Tucson, AZ. This "Dust Devil Invitational" pitted 20 WFTDA leagues against each other for the national title. The 3-day event was sold out weeks beforehand and had to turn away hundreds of people every day.

#### **Gotham Girls On The Web**

Garnering more than 85,000 page views per month, the GGRD Web site is an invaluable promotional tool for the league.
